

The fact that our schedule of events coincides with this important religious holiday was an honest mistake, that we regret. On behalf of the Board and management team of the Organizing Committee, I wish to unreservedly apologize to you and the community for this regrettable scheduling oversight on our part.

We thank you for bringing this conflict to our attention in the professional and respectful manner that you did. We will post a copy of this letter on our website as a way of expressing our apology publicly.
